1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The Clarion-Limestone Area School District will continue to review updates from the CDC and emerging guidance from the DOH and PDE for information on how to maintain a healthy in-person learning environment for children and a healthy working environment for staff. All mandates from these agencies will be followed. Practices established concerning cleaning, screening methods, contact tracing, quarantines, and communication to families, staff and school board will continue as needed.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Clarion-Limestone Area School District will continue to maintain continuity of services by offering in-person academic learning with a district operated cyber option, if necessary, for health reasons. The social-emotional, mental health, physical health, and food services will be provided to all students through the school year.

The District provides comprehensive services to all students by having a guidance counselor in each of its buildings and a full-time social worker as well as outside agencies. The District will continue to provide accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to their health and safety needs. If the District is mandated to close, these accommodations will be provided virtually.

All students K-12 will receive free breakfast and lunch for the 2021-22 school year. Should the District be closed longer than a week, meals will be provided via school buses on existing bus routes.

All students K-12 will be provided a device (Chromebook/I-pad) for the 2021-22 school year. This 1:1 initiative will afford teachers and students to use devices during their school day so that if Clarion-Limestone is mandated to shut down, teaching will continue flawlessly remotely. Students will be given hot spots if needed and paper packets as a last resort.

Learning loss will be a focus and programs implemented to meet student needs.

Large group instruction rooms, auditoriums, cafeterias, gymnasiums and outdoor areas will be utilized, if necessary.

Visual reminders will be posted throughout the buildings and students will be taught proper handwashing techniques.

This will include, but is not limited to, common surfaces, door handles/knobs and higher traffic areas. New staff will be trained on effective cleaning, sanitizing, and disinfecting.</p> <p>A deep cleaning of the buildings will occur after all staff have vacated the building for the day.</p> <p>All cleaning products used will be safe and monitored by the use of the MSDS references.</p> <p>The District will adhere to proper ventilation efforts to the maximum extent</p>

Communication will occur with the PA Department of Health.</p>
<p>f. <a href="#">Diagnostic</a> and screening testing;</p>	<p>The District will encourage parents to perform screening procedures and keep their child home if there are signs of illness.</p> <p>All District staff will be encouraged to perform a symptom screening prior to leaving for work and will stay home if there are signs of illness.</p> <p>If symptoms present themselves while students or staff are at school they will be referred to the school nurse for diagnostic screening.</p>
<p>g. Efforts to provide <a href="#">vaccinations to school communities</a>;</p>	<p>The District will promote, staff, families and students to seek out vaccine providers. The District may share communications regarding clinics and other methods of receiving a vaccination; including, but not limited to an on-campus vaccination clinic.</p>
