A Busy and Productive Summer

1. **Implementation of RIASEC Career Exploration Model in Middle School**

Goal: Create a more personalized, interest-driven academic experience that connects coursework to future careers.
2. **Development of Elementary Greenhouse Curriculum**
 - Create at least one interdisciplinary, standards-aligned instructional unit per grade (K–5).
 - Provide hands-on, greenhouse-based learning experiences.
 - Integrate STEM and environmental literacy into the elementary curriculum.
Goal: Ensure every class participates in at least one greenhouse-based project annually.
3. **Business Office Efficiency and Accuracy**
 - Provide monthly financial reports to the School Board.
 - Complete monthly reconciliation of bank accounts.
 - Implement accurate fund transfer processes.
 - Ensure timely budget amendments before fiscal year-end.
