I am Rebecca Allison. I joined our board in December of 2019. My main reason for running for school director was to help facilitate better communication throughout the district. In my short time on this board, I believe we have made great strides!

Tonight, we have a very hot-button issue to discuss and vote upon. For many, it is very emotional, for some, very political. My hope is that we, as a community, can listen to the plans being offered and understand that no matter where your personal opinions about Covid-19 lie, from: "This is a Hoax" to "The sky is falling!", our administration is responsible for the education and safety of ALL the children in our district. We are also responsible for the safety of ALL our district staff. As a school board, we must address and respect the needs and concerns of ALL - and no one family or group is going to receive everything they desire in a plan.

I am asking all of us to consider the absolute reality that "school" is going to look a whole lot different when we return. There are guidelines we MUST follow - whether we agree with them or not. Please, use these links to ask your questions so everyone can see the questions and the answers provided. Communication is key. Compromise and patience are necessary. Clarion-Limestone has a wonderful reputation for being the best education in our county. If we want this to continue, we must adapt and overcome the challenges of this pandemic. We CAN succeed. We need to trust that our district, who has continued to thrive throughout the years, will continue to make the necessary adjustments and changes and will continue to provide a high quality education for ALL.
