The Clarion-Limestone Area School District will continue to review updates from the CDC and emerging guidance from the DOH and PDE for information on how to maintain a healthy in-person learning environment for children and a healthy working environment for staff. All mandates from these agencies will be followed. Practices established concerning cleaning, screening methods, contact tracing, quarantines, and communication to families, staff and school board will continue as needed.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Clarion-Limestone Area School District will meet the academic needs by providing full, in-person instruction grades K-12. The district will also continue to maintain continuity of services by offering academic learning provided by agreement with the Titusville Area School District if necessary, for student health reasons. The social-emotional, mental health, physical health, and food services will be provided to all students through the school year.

The District provides comprehensive services to all students in each building and a full-time social worker as well as outside agencies. The District will continue to provide accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to their health and safety needs. If the District is mandated to close, these accommodations will be provided virtually.

Should the District be closed longer than a week, meals will be provided via school buses on existing bus routes.

All students K-12 will be provided a device (Chromebook/I-pad) for the 2022-23 school year. This 1:1 initiative will afford teachers and students to use devices during their school day so that if Clarion-Limestone is mandated to shut down, teaching will continue flawlessly remotely. Students will be given hot spots if needed and paper packets as a last resort.

Learning loss will be a focus and programs implemented to meet student needs.

This will include, but is not limited to, common surfaces, door handles/knobs and higher traffic areas. New staff will be trained on effective cleaning, sanitizing, and disinfecting. A deep cleaning of the buildings will occur after all staff have vacated the building for the day.
	All cleaning products used will be safe and monitored by the use of the MSDS references. The District will adhere to proper ventilation efforts to the maximum extent

	All District staff will be encouraged to perform a symptom screening prior to leaving for work and will stay home if there are signs of illness.
	If symptoms present themselves while students or staff are at school they will be referred to the school nurse for diagnostic screening.
